

Summer Growth Plans

Here is what we do...

Summer is the perfect time of year to introduce new families to JBQ and to excite kids about the upcoming year of having fun learning God's Word with their friends.

Mid-Week Summer Program – We changed up our church's midweek programming in the summer to be based around Bible Fact-Pak questions. We teach 5-10 new questions each week and at the end of the summer we give the kids a chance to answer ten randomly selected questions for a ribbon, a pizza party, or other awesome prizes! We let all the families know where the questions came from, and invite them to join JBQ in the Fall.

JBQ Ice Cream Party – Invite the families in your church to a Sunday afternoon ice cream party to learn about an awesome new program that will help their kids learn God's Word.

JBQ Fun Day – Consider for your own church kids, and as an event for multiple churches in your area. For our JBQ Fun Day, we had separate tracks for parents and kids. With the kids we played games outside, introduced some of the easier 10-point JBQ questions, had some ice cream, then let them try quizzing with a quiz box (we separated the kids who had quizzed before and those who hadn't). With the parents we spoke about the vision of the JBQ program, walked them through a JBQ match, gave them ideas on how to help their child study, and trained them how to be officials.

JBQ Highlight in the Sanctuary – Talk with your Lead Pastor about the possibility of having some kids quiz against some of the pastors or elders in your church on a Sunday morning. Just be sure to give the kids the questions beforehand, so they can show off their skills!
